The faith of Abraham

⁸ By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going.

⁹ By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise.

¹⁰ For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God.

¹¹ By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old - and Sarah herself was barren - because he considered him faithful who had promised.

¹² Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, 'as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.' Read slowly through the passage a couple of times and then find a word or phrase that jumps out to you and think what it is saying to you.

Read the passages from Acts and wonder about the Faith that was needed to follow God's call. Ponder when and how you have heard God calling you. Remember how you responded and how it felt. Reflect on how it feels to follow God's direction when the outcome is unknown. What is it like looking back?
